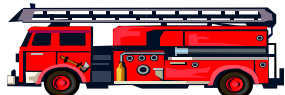

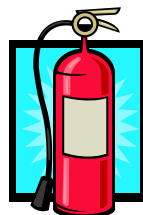

The Board of Supervisors is the governing body of Fairfax County. It consists of nine members elected by district, with each district of approximate equal population, plus a chairman elected at-large. Board members are elected to four-year terms.

The Board establishes county government policy, approves resolutions and ordinances (within limits of its authority established by the Virginia General Assembly), approves the budget, sets local tax rates, approves land use plans, and makes appointments to various non-elected positions. The Board appoints a county executive, who is the administrative head of the county government and is responsible for the administration of all the affairs of the county, which the Board has authority to control. The Board usually meets two Tuesdays per month in the Board Auditorium at the Fairfax Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax. Meetings are open to the public and are broadcast live on cable Channel 16.

Penny Gross was first elected to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors for the Mason District in November 1995, and was re-elected to her fifth term on November 8, 2011. Ms. Gross also is vice-chair of the Board, and she chairs the Board's Personnel Policy and Reorganization Committee, and the Board's Environment Committee.

Regionally, Supervisor Gross represents Fairfax County on the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG), which she chaired in 2009. She also represents Fairfax County on the Northern Virginia Regional Commission where she serves as vice chairman. Supervisor Gross represents Fairfax County on the INOVA Health System Board of Trustees, and on the Potomac Watershed Roundtable, which she also chairs.

On the state and national level, Supervisor Gross is President-elect of the Virginia Association of Counties. She currently is vice-chair of the National Association of Counties' Energy, Environment, and Land Use Committee. She became President of the National Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors in June 2013. Supervisor Gross was appointed by Governor Mark Warner to the Local Government Advisory Committee (LGAC) to the Chesapeake Executive Council, which she chaired from March 2006 until August 2008.

Prior to her tenure as Supervisor, Ms. Gross worked for 20 years as staff in various congressional offices. She served on the Board of the Lincoln Park Civic Association (1985 to 1997), and on the Executive Board of the Mason District Council of Civic Associations (1988 to 1995). She has held numerous offices with PTA, and is an Honorary Life Member of the Virginia State PTA.

A founding member of the Friends of Mason District Park, Ms. Gross continues to be an active member and officer. She also is a founding member and officer of the National Capital Chapter of the University of Oregon Alumni Association. Supervisor Gross was co-manager of Girl Scouts Service Unit 52-4 for nine years.

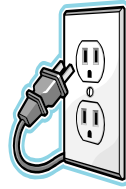

Register to Vote – In Fairfax County, you may register to vote year-round except during the 22 days prior to a General or Primary election, 13 days prior to a Special election, or 7 days prior to a Special election called by the Governor. To register, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years of age by the next general election, and a resident of Virginia. You may register in person at the Office of the General Registrar at the Fairfax County Government Center, Suite 323, or call 703-324-4700 for other registration sites. You also may apply by mail. Pick up registration forms at Department of Motor Vehicles offices, public libraries, public schools, or in the Supervisor's office at the Mason District Governmental Center, located at 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. Call 703-222-0776 for voter registration assistance.

Pet Owner Responsibilities – All dogs four months and older must be licensed each year. Dog licenses, which go on sale in November for the coming year, may be purchased by mail or in person at the Department of Tax Administration in the Fairfax County Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway, or the Fairfax County Animal Shelter, 4500 West Ox Road in Fairfax. The fee is \$10 for all dogs, whether spayed or neutered. A current rabies vaccination certificate must be shown. Please remember to keep your dog on a leash when walking, and clean up after your pet.

Enroll Children in School – Newcomers should call 703-204-6740 to find out which schools serve their new address. Parents should bring a birth certificate, Social Security number, proof of Fairfax County residency, and a transfer slip and report card from the previous school to the school office when enrolling a child. Evidence of immunization is required of all students, and a certificate of physical exam is required for elementary students.

Recycle – All county residents with curbside refuse collection are required to recycle newspaper, metal, food, and beverage cans, glass bottles and jars, scrap metal, and yard debris. All apartment/condominium residents should be able to recycle cardboard and mixed paper onsite. Apartments/condominiums built *after* July 2007 are required to provide onsite recycling for metal food & beverage cans, glass bottles & jars, plastic bottles & jugs and scrap metal. This level of service is optional for communities built before July 2007. Commercial recycling is mandatory for certain businesses. Other programs include yard debris and recycling drop-off centers located throughout Fairfax County. For more information, call the 24-hour Automated Recycling InfoLine at 703-324-5052.
